

Congress Kills Community Access to the Airwaves"
Prometheus Radio Project - After nearly a decade of unlicensed low power broadcasting, in January of 2000, the Federal Communications Commission created a legal service. Now, a year later, that Low Power FM (LPFM) service has been eviscerated by Congress thanks to pressure from the National Association of Broadcasters and National Public Radio. On October 26 and 27, 2000 Congress added anti-LPFM language to the Commerce, Justice, State Appropriations bill that cut back 60%-80% of the low power radio stations. President Clinton signed this bill into law in December. Low power FM had been one of the most significant wins in the movement for media and democracy in recent years. What is left is the skeletal remains of a new radio service. Amy Kwasnicki, (aka Joan Dark), a member of the Prometheus Radio collective, will discuss how close we came to having access to our own airwaves, how swiftly it was crunched by the corporate powers of America, and what remains. If there is any doubt how afraid the corporate powers are in this country of any semblance of real democracy and access to broadcasting, the story of this humble radio service reveals it."

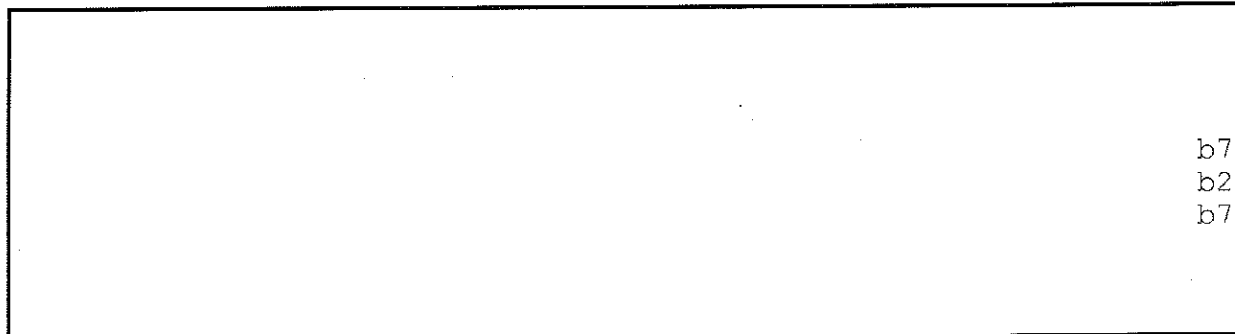

On January 30, 2001, an investigative strategy meeting was held at the Golden Police Department to discuss the status and direction of the Kohl's Department Store investigation. The meeting was attended by writer and JTTF Detective [redacted] as well as members of the Golden Police Department (GPD) and Jefferson County District Attorney's Office.

The GPD has conducted numerous interviews of individuals associated with the Denver Justice and Peace Committee to determine the relationship between the DJPC and the criminal activity (destruction of property) which took place at Kohl's Department Store on December 9, 2000. Although many of these individuals have been cooperative, the information obtained has been of limited investigative value. The reports of these interviews are being maintained by the GPD.

The majority of the individuals contacted are members of the DJPC, and they denounced the criminal activities of the Santa Clauses at Kohl's Department Store last December. The DJPC membership has generally attempted to distance the organization from the Kohl's incident, with particular dissatisfaction expressed regarding the actions of DJPC [redacted]

Investigators will continue to focus efforts on identification of the other three individuals disguised as Santa Claus. [redacted] was previously identified through photographs and vehicle identification as the fourth Santa Claus. The Jefferson County District Attorney intends to seek [redacted] indictment before the grand jury in April. [redacted] will also be given an opportunity to cooperate by identifying the other participants in the vandalism at Kohl's.

In an effort to further identify associates of [redacted] a request will be submitted to the FBI SOG for surveillance of [redacted]. A videotape recovered from a security camera at the DJPC office shows [redacted] meeting with three individuals dressed in Santa suits on the morning of December 9, 2000. [redacted] has publicly denied any knowledge or association with any individuals in Santa suits on that day.

In addition, writer provided GPD with photographs developed from the December 9, 2000, security video which was previously obtained from the American Justice and Peace Center. Cops seek leads on Santas Contact activists with ties to Denver Peace & Justice Center

Detectives continue to investigate the four protesters who days before Christmas dressed up in Santa Claus outfits and used orange spray paint to cause an estimated \$50,000 in damage to merchandise at the new Kohl's department store in Golden.

According to the Denver Justice and Peace Committee, the Santas acted on their own and were unaffiliated with the DJPC. The DJPC said it organized the demonstration outside the store as a part of a nationwide effort to bring attention to the issue of sweatshop labor in Central America.

The Golden Police Department has yet to make arrests stemming from the Dec. 9 incident.

"We hope to make arrests, yes," Capt. Bill Kilpatrick of the Golden Police Department said. "But I can't really say what the timeframe of that will be."

Felony charges could be filed, Kilpatrick said.

Three search warrants were implemented in connection with the police investigation -- one at the DJPC -- but what was confiscated is known only by police and suspects.

"That's all sealed, and I'm not at liberty to discuss that at this time," Kilpatrick said.

Yet Kerry Appel, a coffee importer who runs the "fair-trade" Human Bean Co. and a cafe in Denver, said the search warrant conducted at the Denver office of the DJPC located near Santa Fe and West 14th Avenue gave police access to that organization's numerous community contacts.

"When (police detectives) came to the Denver Justice and Peace Committee to execute their search warrant, people heard them specifically ask for, look for and take Chiapas Coalition records," Appel said.

Appel is also a leader in the loosely knit Chiapas Coalition, a group that Appel said has between 30-200 members, all concerned for human rights in Mexico. Three members of the Chiapas Coalition,

including Appel, were arrested in 1999 during a protest of trade policies at a U.S.-Mexico Chamber of Commerce conference attended by Gov. Bill Owens. The three were later exonerated in court when a judge, and then a jury, found the meeting to be public and that members had engaged in an act of free speech.

On Wednesday, Appel was contacted by police detectives attempting to locate the Santas.

"If the police are calling people who may not even have been involved in the Chiapas Coalition for a long time, that's totally unjustified, and I'm sure, unwelcome," Appel said. "Members of the Chiapas Coalition are not even members of the Denver Justice and Peace Committee. The coalition was not even a sponsor or participant in the demonstration."

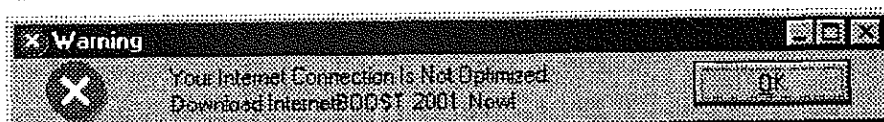
Kilpatrick said he could not address Appel's concerns.

"I can't really comment as to what Mr. Appel is feeling one way or the other," Kilpatrick said. "He was contacted by the Golden Police Department, that's about all I can say."

Added Kilpatrick: "We're still doing our investigation, contacting people. We're trying to identify the Santas. So we're contacting people who may know who the Santas were."

Appel, who happened to be with a lawyer during the contact, urged Kilpatrick not to contact more members of the Chiapas Coalition. He added that he is encouraging members of the Chiapas Coalition not to speak with police.

"Police contacting people in a focused manner like that is a concern -- especially when it appears targeted at a group," Appel said.



Man faces jail over contempt

JEFFERSON COUNTY — A 35-year-old Denver man could spend up to a half-year in jail if he doesn't agree to cooperate with a grand jury attempting to unmask four renegade Santa Clauses.

Doug Bohm was taken into custody Thursday after he was found in contempt. A hearing scheduled for May 31 will determine whether he has decided to testify.

Bohm is believed to be a witness to a vandalism incident Dec. 9.

Four men in Santa suits ran through a Kohl's store in Golden with cans of spray paint, causing thousands of dollars in damage.

No one has been charged.
